FRENCH PM EDOUARD PHILIPPE ADRESSED A SPEECH AT WORLD ELECTRONICS FORUM IN ANGER

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USPA NEWS - The city has been chosen to host the next World Electronics Forum (WEF). The announcement of this meeting was made on January 6th by Christophe Bechu, Mayor of Angers, at the Consumer Electronics Show (CES) in Las Vegas. The Prime Minister walks in the footsteps of the President Emmanuel Macron a fervent defender of the "French Tech" and his many trips (including CES (Consumer Electronics, Las Vegas)). Prime Minister Edouard Philippe went to Angers and attended the WEF where he gave an introductory speech along with WEF President Gary Shapiro and Christian Bechu, the Mayor of the city of Angers, and recalled the efforts and progress made by France in this regard. electronics. He insisted on the "Loire We Network". The PM also recalled the industrial past linked to the history of France in this region of Anjou. I am thinking of the path taken by Angers, by the Loire We Network cluster and by the French federation of electronic industries to offer France, for the first time in its history, and to Europe for the second time, the organization of this event. I would like to tell them that they made the right choice. That they had a hollow nose. Normal, you say, it's their job to invest in the future.-----

- First because Angers has an imaginative, energetic and talented mayor, who is also a fellow traveler and a dear friend. We could not find better interlocutor to make this week a success to the extent of the event.

- Then because in Angers, smart objects, "customized", perhaps not connected but "interactive" in their own way, we have known for a long time. Since the 14th century to be precise, since the day when the Duke Louis I of Anjou ordered the merchant Nicolas Bataille, the most incredible tapestry ever made, inspired by the apocalypse of Saint John and that we can admire at Castle of Angers.

- Finally because Angers has created an ecosystem unique in the world in the field of electronics. An ecosystem that brings together the best of French Tech and French Fab, which is based on:“

- o On an industrial fabric that was born in the early sixties and which, with companies like Bull, Thomson, Packard Bell, Thales, participated in the first revolution of electronics.

- o On the structuring of a sector, around world champions of Electronic Manufacturing Services (EMS) two of which, Eolane and Lacroix Electronic, are located in the Pays-de-la-Loire, around a myriad of companies innovative, large institutions of higher and technical education. I am thinking, for example, of the Western Electronics College, which is located right here in Angers, which trained Michel Hugon, father of the smart card with processor, and Jean-Pascal Tricoire, the current CEO of Schneider. Electric.

- o An ecosystem that is also based on a private-public "co-financing" logic. The city of the connected object has received funding from the State, the Pays-de-la-Loire region, the agglomeration of Angers and local businesses alongside the 18 private investors. Just as the state financially supports the Cap'Tronic program that helps SMEs to integrate electronic solutions into their products." Proudly explained Edouard Philippe, French PM, while making an inventory of the French innovative and creative tech, especially in Angers, To be continued in next article...

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
